How will the data be stored?
Oracle Fusion is a Cloud based service - which means that the Council in effect has a subscription to use and store data on Oracle's secure servers.
The servers for Fusion are based in Oracle's Amsterdam data centre. Data can be viewed by Oracle employees (necessary if the Council's environments have a support issue that needs to be resolved), as well as, when required, any consulting resources the Council chooses to use to assist with project work.
What is the legal basis for the collection, use and storage of the data?

Oracle Support is a global organisation, with centres in the USA, Romania and India, the data uploaded and work to resolve issues may be carried out outside of the EU. Oracle vet all support staff. Any data viewed outside the EU will not be stored.
