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MOBILE OPERATORS ANNUAL NETWORK UPDATE PLANS 2015/2016

We are contacting you on behalf of the Mobile Operators Association (MOA) which represents the four UK mobile phone network operators (EE, Telefónica, Three, and Vodafone) on network development issues.

Mobile connectivity brings huge benefits to individuals, communities, and businesses across the country. The mobile network is a crucial piece of national infrastructure but it is built and delivered locally. For this reason, local planning authorities are vital partners in bringing the benefits of mobile communications to their areas.

The mobile operators are committed to transparency and engagement with local government and as part of this, send updated information about the location of their base station sites to each Local Planning Authority in October each year. As part of their commitments under the Code of Best Practice on Mobile Network Development in England^[1], operators have also undertaken to provide professional development workshops on technological and other developments within telecommunications for local planning authority officers and elected members.
