How will the data be stored? <p>Our computer system is accessed via secure connections and hosted on secure servers, in a remote data centre in the UK.</p> <p>Where we have data held on paper, this will be minimal, stored in a locked area, scanned where possible and kept for no longer than necessary to deal with the transaction.</p>
What is the legal basis for the collection, use and storage of the data? <p>The Council has a statutory duty to maintain the highway</p> <p>Highways Act 1980</p>
